## PAGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Spring has well and truly sprung or at least "splashed" in. After the summer drought of 2023 the daffodils, so famous on Pagham Road for heralding Spring, were not to their usual standard. Remember the drought of last summer because it starved the bulbs of enough water to set flower buds for this year.

This year is the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day 1944. One of the events planned nationally is a beacon chain along the coast. PPC will organise a beacon on the evening of the 6<sup>th</sup> June to be part of this commemoration. We will be working with Pagham Yacht Club and Pagham and District Residents' Association and will share details on our website and via their social media feeds. Residents are welcome to attend and mark the important role Pagham played in D-Day.

Winter has given us time to catch up on some of the jobs around the village. At the start of last year, Southern Water began work on the modernisation and expansion of the Summer Lane sewage work. As a gift to the village SW donated 2 benches for the Paddock at the Village Hall. We have now added a third from PPC and so visitors can now sit and chat in comfort whilst exercising their dogs or meeting friends.

The playground at Hook Lane is no longer at the edge of the village, thanks to the large-scale housing developments. We have recently begun to open up this green space so that it is part of an improved landscape serving its neighbourhood. The green space will have a mature trees boundary, a lowered and less invasive fencing line and improved visibility of the children's playground.

One area we have been unable to improve is the square in front of the shops on The Parade. The area is owned by a property investor and has been neglected over many years with little or no investment in maintenance. Arun District Council has served enforcement notices to ensure the safety of tenants and for the repair of the square. Unfortunately, this has not yet resulted in any improvements or access for the village. We hope this will change this year. PPC has investigated the possibility of becoming involved in ownership and repair, but such a resolution is beyond our remit and could have resulted in higher charges for businesses.

Our next task is at the children's playground by the Village Hall. The fencing will be replaced as it has reached the end of life.

There is a new area of playground on the green open space in Summer Lane which PPC has been asked to take on. However, there are several problems with the site that need to be corrected before this can happen. Not least of the problems is the presence of asbestos there. The land has been raised without planning permission and consequently drainage flows through neighbours' gardens, the landscaping has been poorly executed and the mound that has been built is too high for safety and in a shape that does not give visibility to what is happening in the park. However, we are working with Arun District Council and the developers to rectify these problems before hopefully taking on the space.

Arun District Council is holding a drop in event at the *Village Hall* (*Small Hall*) on *Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> April* from *2.00pm to 4.00pm* to answer questions on their Direction of Travel Regulation 18 consultation which will inform the next local plan.

Basically now is the time to start voicing your opinions – the strategic sites (Hook Lane, Sefter Road, Pagham Road) all came about from the last local plan and it is worth commenting at all stages to try and prevent more unwanted housing being foisted on Pagham.

## **TIM'S GARDENING TIPS**

#### **SUMMER 2024**

In my role as head gardener at Crouchers Hotel and Restaurant, I am often asked for tips and advice. Sometimes I can offer sage words of wisdom, other times it is not so simple, and occasionally it is like the blind leading the blind. For example, once a daffodil comes up blind, will it ever flower again?

The short answer is yes, but the cure is not necessarily straight forward. For starters, if the bulbs have become overcrowded then it can affect flowering, so old clumps should be lifted, separated and replanted at the correct depth.

As with all flowers, they should be deadheaded to prevent them going to seed, but with daffs, even though they will not re-flower, keep as much of the foliage as possible. The more foliage, the more area for photosynthesis, the more energy goes into the bulb, the more likely they will flower again the following season. If your daffs have found their way into a shaded area, try pruning back surrounding plants to allow the sunrays in.

Alternatively, when the foliage starts to die away, try feeding with a high potash feed or growmore - it could trigger the bulbs back into life. Something else that can reduce a bulb's vigour and hence flowering, is the old double whammy of pests and disease. The larvae of narcissus bulb fly, and the narcissus eelworm are two such enemies, and if there is any sign of these it is best to lift all affected bulbs and destroy them. Conditions such as narcissus basal rot can be equally damaging, and easily spread between clumps of bulbs.

I know it can be frustrating when the bulbs you've carefully planted in your borders fail to flower, and yet the daffodils on a unpleasant roundabout in the middle of the city flower every year. But, hopefully, now we know that all is not lost, we can see a way forward, and once where we were blind, now we can see.
